


### Overview of requirements to fish an SATT event:

1. You must be a member of a High School Fishing team and have an active SAF membership. The head coach of each high school team should be able to assist you with getting your number.
2. Read and understand the rules. [Rules Document Link](#)
3. Complete a [Student Angler Liability Waiver](#) if you're an angler or a [Boat Captain Waiver](#) if you are a boat captain, before registering for an event. This is one time per season form that is needed. Please note that if you use a legal name on the waiver form and then a shortened name on the registration form the form will not match up with your registration and you may receive correspondence from us that you haven't completed a liability waiver form yet.
4. Register for a tournament at [www.mnsatt.org](http://www.mnsatt.org). Go to the Tournament Information page, select Tournament Registration and Information and scroll down to select which event you would like to register for. Click on the link and complete the registration form and submit payment.
5. Get an approved Ruler to register your fish during the tournament. **The only approved ruler is a SATT Branded ruler.**
6. Download the Reel LiveWell and Timestamp app from your Apple or Google Play Store on your smartphone. You will need to take each photo in the Timestamp app and upload it to the Reel LiveWell app to register each fish. Check the flyers at the bottom for more information.



7. Attend the mandatory Rules Meeting the evening before your event. Check in starts one hour before the meeting start time. If you attend virtually there is no check in needed.
8. Launch your boat from any landing and wait at your starting spot to start fishing at 7am. Fishing will end at 2pm. Please note that the TOC and State Team event will have a live take off weather permitting. For the TOC and the State Team event you will receive a randomly drawn boat number for take off for these events only.



### In Person Rules Meetings:

1. Rules meetings are held at 6pm the night before each event and check in starts at 5pm. Unless noted otherwise. It is mandatory that one angler & the boat captain attend.
2. The SATT loves seeing all the anglers in person and giving them the opportunity to interact with each other and join in the excitement of the tournament.
3. We will be giving away random prizes at each event at the rules meeting including shimano rods, Scheels Gift Cards, gas cards, etc. Must be present to win.



### Rule Reminders for SATT events:

1. It is the responsibility of each angler and the boat captain to have read, understand and follow all tournament rules. Rules document can be found on our website at [www.mnsatt.org](http://www.mnsatt.org), under tournament information and then rules & forms.
2. The lake is off limits ½ hour prior to the rules meeting for each event. This includes driving, scanning or the use of any underwater cameras or devices.
3. All fish must be registered on the ruler with a Closed Mouth. If the mouth is **not** closed the fish will be rejected.
4. Life jackets must be worn by the student and boat captains while the big motor or any combustion engine is running, no exceptions. NO inflatable life jackets for students, boat captains are allowed to wear either style.
5. Students are NOT allowed to operate the big motor (combustion engine) anytime during the event except to load and unload the boat at the landing.
6. There is only one adult, the boat captain allowed in the boat with the 2 student angler teams during the tournament. Only exception is if an angler's partner is not able to fish and the boat captain is not a parent, legal guardian or family member of the remaining angler. Then an adult observer must ride in the boat for the day, but is not allowed to help net, give ideas, etc.
7. Live bait and trolling are NOT permitted.
8. Minimum countable length of a bass is 12". If the tail of the fish touches a line you will round up ¼". The app will cull your fish for you and count your top 7 fish.
9. Absolutely no fish in the boat LiveWell at any time. If an angler catches a fish that angler is not permitted to fish again until the fish is released. If you need to revive or resuscitate a fish you are permitted to keep it in the net at the side of the boat until it can be released.
10. Fish must be registered on an approved ruler. The only approved ruler is an SATT Branded ruler. **If you are using a non approved ruler your fish will be rejected.**
11. All anglers and boat captains must abide by all state and local laws including lake speed limits and no wake zones, etc. at all times.
12. All anglers and boat captains are expected to show good sportsmanship and be respectful at all times to each other and all other boaters on the water. This includes keeping a reasonable distance from other boats out on the water.
13. The Tournament director has the right to disqualify any teams for not following the rules, unsportsmanlike conduct, safety violations, ect., at any time.

#### Lund Contingency Money:

Lund has sponsored Lund contingency prizes for the past 4 years. At each qualifying event. Here is what the contingency prizes are.

1. Lund awards the top placing 2 person angler team fishing out of any year Lund boat a \$1,000 college scholarship to split.
2. Lund awards the top placing boat captain driving a 2017 or newer Lund, \$2,000 cash. The boat captain will need to complete a W9 form and will receive a 1099 at the end of the year.
3. Lund awards the second placing boat captain driving a 2017 or newer Lund, \$1,000 cash. The boat captain will need to complete a W9 form and will receive a 1099 at the end of the year.



### Other Scholarship Awards:

1. The SATT partners with other organizations to donate scholarships at some events, such as Women Anglers of MN, Mille Lacs Smallmouth Alliance, Mac's Twin Bay, McQuoid's Inn and more. Watch the tournament information sheets for more information about those.
